The nominations selected for the award demonstrated excellence and significantly contributed to the small business mission during the period of October 1, 2019 through September 30, 2020.

THE REVOLUTIONARY LEADERSHIP AWARD

This award goes to the individual that advocates for the inclusion of small business participation, responds to challenges with inventive ways, brings innovation to the Department of Defense through small business utilization, and demonstrates strong leadership abilities.

Mr. Thaddeus L. Martin is awarded the Revolutionary Leadership Award for Fiscal Year 2020. Mr. Martin's dedication, business acumen and unwavering support to the small business program has resulted in substantial and positive impacts to the Army Materiel Command. His commitment to excellence and outstanding leadership to the small business program is evidenced by the continuous increase in small business achievements. In Fiscal Year 2020, Army Materiel Command awarded 53,112 actions and obligated over \$13.5B to small businesses. This was nearly a fourth of all U.S. small business contracting dollars and over half of all U.S. Army dollars spent on small businesses. Emmons distinguished himself as Director, Small Business Programs, Hanscom Operating Location, Air Force Life Cycle Management Center, Air Force Materiel Command, Hanscom Air Force Base, Massachusetts, from 1 October 2019 to 30 September 2020. During this period, under Mr. Emmons' tutelage and tireless efforts, Hanscom Small Business awards soared to new record heights from 893 million dollars in Fiscal Year 2019 to over 1 billion dollars in Fiscal Year 2020 and an amazing 100 percent increase from his arrival in Fiscal Year 2018. Jeff's sagacious teaming with Detachment 12, multiple Kessel Run Program Managers, Contracting Officers, and Materiel Leads in conducting market research and implementing the modular contracting strategy and Information Technology as a service concept to perfection. His actions resulted in the award of twenty plus 8(a) Set-Asides, Service Disable Veteran Owned Small Business Set-Asides, and Small Business Set-Asides in support of the twenty three Air Operation Centers located around the world as well as logistic elements of the F-35 program. Mr. Emmons' reach and determination ultimately supported the warfighter and our country's industrial base. SOCOM SBIR LP Team

The USSOCOM FY20 NDAA Section 851 Pilot Program for Development of Technology-Enhanced Capabilities with Partnership Intermediaries team has distinguished themselves by executing groundbreaking streamlined and innovative acquisition processes in support of USSOCOM Small Business Innovative Research, SBIR, program while assigned to United States Special Operations Command, MacDill Air Force Base, Florida. The team's collaborative approach has created a Command-wide culture of collaboration and innovation within our small business partners seeking to provide advanced, disruptive technologies for the SOF warfighter. The demonstrated increased participation by 100%, reduced contracting time by approximately 80%, and decreased time from initial award to prototype delivery by 60% is proof that this innovative legislative proposal is changing the way the Command can gain access to new small business innovation that is key to SOF modernization while maintaining all statutory requirements of the SBIR program. AFLCMC Small Business Office Air Force Life Cycle Management Center

The Air Force Life Cycle Management Center Small Business Office, Air Force Materiel Command, Wright-Patterson AFB, Ohio, distinguished themselves from 1 October 2019 through 30 September 2020. During this time, the Air Force Life Cycle Management Center experienced an outstanding Small Business fiscal year by surpassing over \$3.6B for small business spend, exceeding the Senior Leader Performance Expectation Small Business goal of 5.89 percent resulting in 10.87 percent, for Program Executive Offices/non-Program Executive Offices. Compared to FY19, the team increased small business spend by approximately \$377M. During FY20, the office remained dedicated to small business outreach through a variety of widely attended events that focused on promoting small business opportunities as well as addressing acquisition issues. Senior leader involvement was highly invested; the team kept leadership current at Senior Leader Staff meetings and highly attended outreach and training events. The Small Business Office participated in successful training opportunities for acquisition professionals, and worked to provide the acquisition community with the most current small business topics through the strategic 'Small News' newsletter in a virtual environment during COVID. The distinctive accomplishments of the Air Force Life Cycle Management Center Small Business Office reflects great credit upon themselves and the United States Air Force.
